#### "Light on New Netherland" Exhibit

This exhibit will be available for viewing on Mother's Day. It features 26 story boards which trace the years the Dutch ruled in New Netherland – from Henry Hudson's discovery in 1609 to Peter Stuyvesant's surrender of the colony to the English in 1664. The panels deal with many aspects of the Dutch experience, including the fur trade, the establishment of government and religion, and the interaction between the Colonists and the American Indians. The exhibit was created by the New Netherland Institute to help celebrate the 2009 quadricentennial of Henry Hudson's voyage up the Hudson River in 1609.


