Knickerbockers in Madison County, NY

This document attempts to identify every Knickerbocker in census records for Madison County, NY.

Newspaper stories and other records have been used to confirm each person's identity.

Pages 2 to 8 contain a list of people and brief biographical information. For example, John Knickerbocker is person number 1:

 John Knickerbocker (1763-1860) was the son of Harmon and Thankful Hogoboom Knickerbocker of Litchfield County, Connecticut. (John was from the 5th generation of Knickerbockers: HJ-1/ Laurens-2 / John-3 / Harmon-4 / John-5.) John Knickerbocker of Salisbury CT married Lydia Jackson of Sharon CT in 1785. They moved to Eaton, Madison County, in about 1803. John shows up in multiple census records. John's five sons also show up in census records. (Lydia and the two daughters, Laura and Lucy, are not named in Madison County census records, because the first every-name census didn't happen until 1850.) John is grave # 98581997 in Findagrave.

Pages 9 to 14 are a list of census records, with each person linked to a specific biography. For example, John Knickerbocker was the first "Knickerbocker" to show up in Madison County census records:

Knickerbockers in Madison County, NY

Note: This is not a family tree. The listing below does not include every spouse and child. Instead, the objective is to identify people named "Knickerbocker" who show up in records for Madison County.

 John Knickerbocker (1763-1860) was the son of Harmon and Thankful Hogoboom Knickerbocker of Litchfield County, Connecticut. (John was from the 5th generation of Knickerbockers: HJ-1 / Laurens-2 / John-3 / Harmon-4 / John-5.) John Knickerbocker of Salisbury CT married Lydia Jackson of Sharon CT in 1785. They moved to Eaton, Madison County, in about 1803. John shows up in multiple census records. John's five sons also show up in census records. (Lydia and the two daughters, Laura and Lucy, are not named in Madison County census records, because the first every-name census didn't happen until 1850.) John is Findagrave # 98581997 in Cincinnatus, Cortland County, New York.

Madison County Knickerbockers who are linked to John and Lydia

- <u>Harmon Knickerbocker</u> (1786-1871) was the son of John and Lydia Jackson Knickerbocker. Harmon later moved to Allegany County, and then to Cattaraugus County. Grave # 120052520 in Lyndon, Cattaraugus County, New York.
- <u>Emerline Knickerbocker</u> (1819-1894) was the daughter of Harmon and Phebe Knickerbocker. There is one record linking her to Madison County: the 1855 NY state census, which recorded her birthplace. Emerline's obituary mentioned siblings Charlotte Nettleton and Geo. B. Knickerbocker. Grave # 120212998 in Lyndon, Cattaraugus County, New York.
- 4. <u>Charlotte Knickerbocker</u> (1827-1889) was the daughter of Harmon and Phebe Knickerbocker. There is one record linking her to Madison County: the 1855 NY state census, which recorded her birthplace. Charlotte's obituary mentioned brother George B. Knickerbocker. Grave # 120183413 in Lydon, Cattaraugus County, New York.
- 5. <u>George B. Knickerbocker</u> (1824-1902) was the son of Harmon and Phebe Knickerbocker. There is one record related to Madison County: George's death certificate says he was born in Madison County, (and that he was the son of Harmon Knickerbocker). Grave # 144698326 in Valhalla, Westchester County, New York.
- 6. <u>Peter Knickerbocker</u> (1789-1879) was the son of John and Lydia Knickerbocker. Like all of his siblings, Peter was born in Connecticut before John and Lydia relocated to Eaton. He married Hannah Bailey. Peter is in the 1820 census for Eaton, with his young family, and lived his later life in Potter County, PA. The link between the Potter County man and the Madison County man is confirmed by records related to daughter Melissa Knickerbocker. Peter is grave # 64138066. His actual grave has not been located, and the findagrave posting has some errors in it.

- 7. <u>Melissa Knickerbocker</u> (1819-1910) was one of the daughters of Peter Knickerbocker. She married Harvey Allen in Pennsylvania, and lived for a time in Potter County, PA. There is one record linking Melissa to Madison County: her baptism record when she joined the LDS church gives her birthplace as Madison County, NY. Later, her death record shows that her father was Peter Knickerbocker. Findagrave says she was born in Potter County, PA, but this conflicts with her baptism record. Grave is # 21521353 in Ainsworth, Brown County, Nebraska.
- Henry (Harry) Knickerbocker (1791-1881) was the son of John and Lydia Jackson Knickerbocker. He was usually called Harry, but it appears his given name was Henry; records exist with both names. Grave # 32251136 in Cincinnatus, Cortland County, New York.
- Franklin Fitch (FF) Knickerbocker, 1826-1905, was the son of Henry and Louisa Brigham Knickerbocker. There is one record connecting him to Madison County: the 1855 NY state census, which recorded his birthplace. Grave # 110870662 in Clarendon, Orleans County, New York.
- <u>Harley Knickerbocker</u>, 1795 1881. Harley was the son of John and Lydia Jackson Knickerbocker. Harley lived in Potter County, PA in about 1816 to 1821. He returned to Eaton after his first wife died. Grave # 45758721 in Morrisville, Madison County, New York.
- **11.** <u>Henrietta French Knickerbocker</u> (1797-1871) was the second wife of Harley. Grave # 45758730 in Morrisville, Madison County, New York.
- 12. Julia Ann Knickerbocker (1822-1891) was the daughter of Harley and Henrietta. There are no census records for Julia Knickerbocker, because she was married to James Brown before 1850. However, Julia Browne was mentioned as next-of-kin in the probate notice for Harley Knickerbocker's will. Grave # 107765953 in Morrisville, Madison County, New York.
- **13.** <u>Edwin Knickerbocker</u> (1824-1896) was the son of Harley and Henrietta. Grave # 45758740 in Morrisville, Madison County, New York.
- 14. <u>Mary Curtis Knickerbocker</u> (1829-1896) was the wife of Edwin Knickerbocker. Grave # 45758748 in Morrisville, Madison County, New York.
- <u>Curtis Edwin Knickerbocker</u> (1867-1942) was the son of Edwin and Mary. Grave # 47521221 in Morrisville, Madison County, New York.
- 16. <u>Flora Van Knickerbocker</u> (1883-) appears to have been the adopted daughter of Curtis Edwin Knickerbocker. She is mentioned in Curtis' obituary. She never shows up in Madison County census results but is mentioned in newspaper stories. Sometime after 1940 she took ownership of Harley's old house in Morrisville, but it appears she later lost the house to foreclosure. She also provided some information to what is now called the Madison County Historic Society; some of her claims about Knickerbocker history were outlandish. Her grave has not been located.
- **17.** <u>Jeanette Knickerbocker</u> (1827-1874), was the daughter of Harley and Henrietta. Grave # 137351066 in Rathbone, Steuben County, New York.

- Sophia Knickerbocker (1831-1905) was the daughter of Harley and Henrietta. Grave # 70200329 in Morrisville, Madison County, New York.
- **19.** <u>Andrew Jackson Knickerbocker</u> (1833-1906) was the son of Harley and Henrietta. Grave # 70200292 in Morrisville, Madison County, New York.
- 20. <u>Mary Reed Knickerbocker</u> (1846-1932) was the wife of Andrew Jackson Knickerbocker. Grave # 70200314 in Morrisville, Madison County, New York.
- <u>Effie Knickerbocker</u> (1867-1905) was the daughter of Andrew and Mary. Grave # 70200515 in Morrisville, Madison County, New York.
- 22. <u>Nina Knickerbocker</u> (1869-1959) was the daughter of Andrew and Mary. Grave # 70200359 in Morrisville, Madison County, New York.
- Susan Knickerbocker (1834-1906) was the daughter of Harley and Henrietta. Grave # 83056137 in Wyanet, Bureau County, Illinois.
- 24. <u>Hiram Knickerbocker</u> (1797-1878) was the son of John and Lydia Jackson Knickerbocker. Grave # 117894391 in Athens, Calhoun County, Michigan.
- 25. <u>Julia Ann Towsley Knickerbocker</u> (1803-1874) was the wife of Hiram. Grave # 117894537 in Athens, Calhoun County, Michigan.
- 26. <u>Charlotte Knickerbocker</u> (1827-1889) was the daughter of Hiram and Julia. Grave # 117891385 in Chesaning, Saginaw County, Michigan.
- 27. <u>Wesley Knickerbocker</u> (1829-1909) was the son of Hiram and Julia. Grave # 25354437 in Chesaning, Saginaw County, Michigan.
- Sarah Ann Knickerbocker (1832-1867) was the daughter of Hiram and Julia. Grave # 22232733 in Lowell, Oneida County, New York.
- 29. <u>Warren Knickerbocker</u> (1842-1913) was the son of Hiram and Julia. Grave # 104341521 in Idana, Clay County, Kansas.
- **30.** <u>William Knickerbocker</u> (1824-1869?) might have been the son of Hiram and Julia. He appears in the Madison County census. Later, after Harriet died, there is a death record for a widower, William Knickerbocker, in Calhoun MI, near where the rest of Hiram's extended family was living. It might be the same person.
- 31. <u>Harriet Knickerbocker</u> (1828-1867) was the wife of William. I believe Harriet was counted twice in 1850. For some reason the Stockbridge census was done several months late, by which time she and her newborn son were living in a household with people who might be her parents. Grave # 25459810 in Munnsville, Madison County, New York.

32. <u>Wm Jr</u> (1850-1853) was the son of William and Harriet. Grave # 25459777 in Munnsville, Madison County, New York.

Madison County Knickerbockers who are linked to Bartholomew

- 33. <u>Bartholomew Knickerbocker</u> (1774- abt 1852) was the son of Harmon and Thankful Hogoboom Knickerbocker, and was the brother of John Knickerbocker. (Bartholomew was a 5th generation of Knickerbockers: HJ-1 / Laurens-2 / John-3 / Harmon-4 / Bartholomew-5.) After Harmon died, Thankful married Stephen Pangborn and moved to Vermont. Thus, Bartholomew's first census entry as a young adult was in Vermont. He and at least some of his children moved to Madison County. Bartholomew's wife died around 1840; her name is unknown. His grave has not been located.
- **34.** <u>John Knickerbocker</u> (1801-1897) was the son of Bartholomew. (Bartholomew was living with his son John in 1850.) Grave # 44115051 in Appleton, Outagamie County, Wisconsin.
- **35.** <u>Sally Williams Knickerbocker</u> (1806-abt 1865) was the wife of John. Her first name was Sarah in at least one record. Grave # 44115505 in Appleton, Outagamie County, Wisconsin.
- **36.** <u>Lucien Knickerbocker</u> (1839-1893) was the son of John and Sally. Grave # 43838888 in Appleton, Outagamie County, Wisconsin.
- Willis Knickerbocker (1845-after 1912) was the son of John and Sally. He was in Wisconsin in 1920.
 His grave has not been located.
- 38. <u>Robert Knickerbocker</u> (1800-after 1855) was probably the son of Bartholomew Knickerbocker. His marriage record, from the Morrisville town clerk: Robert Knickerbocker "of Nelson" married Rachel Howard "of Eaton" 22 Aug 1830. (Nelson is a crossroads just east of Cazenovia. Bartholomew was in Nelson in both 1820 and 1830.) Robert and Rachel never appear in the Madison County census, since they were married after the 1830 census and lived in Oneida by the 1840 census. However, records for children Minor, Janie, and Hiram show that the family lived in Madison County throughout the mid-1830's. Robert and Rachel disappear from census records after 1855; their fate is unknown.
- **39.** <u>Rachel Howard Knickerbocker</u> (1810) was the wife of Robert Knickerbocker.
- 40. <u>Minor Knickerbocker</u> (1833-1898) was the son of Robert and Rachel Knickerbocker. He does not appear in the Madison County census, probably because he moved away before the 1850 every-name census. However, his enlistment record gives birth place as Nelson, NY. Grave # 63872802 in Oneida Castle, Oneida County, New York.
- **41.** <u>Flora Knickerbocker</u> (1869-1945) was the wife of Minor Knickerbocker. She does not show up in any Madison County census records as "Knickerbocker." However, she was in the census for 1910 as Flora Harp, living with her second husband. Grave # 63423345 in Oneida Castle, Oneida County, New York.

- **42.** <u>**Ruby Knickerbocker**</u> (1893-1971) was the daughter of Minor Knickerbocker. She was living with Flora and William Harp in 1910. Grave # 64772154 in Oneida Castle, Oneida County, New York.
- **43.** Janie Knickerbocker Harp (1835-1921) was the daughter of Robert and Rachel. The 1855 census (as Jane Harp) shows her birthplace as Madison County. Findagrave also has her death certificate, with Knickerbocker as her maiden name. Grave # 62831788 in Oneida Castle, Oneida County, New York.
- **44.** <u>**Hiram Knickerbocker**</u> (1839-) was the son of Robert and Rachel. The 1855 census shows his birthplace as Madison County.
- **45.** <u>Stephen Knickerbocker</u> (abt 1800) was probably the son of Bartholomew Knickerbocker. Not much is known about this son. Many people speculate that he died young, leaving a widow named Betsey. However, it is also possible that he moved away after a divorce. There is a Stephen Knickerbocker who later shows up in Ohio and about the right time in Ohio census records. The Ohio man is grave # 14008497 in Amherst, Lorain County, Ohio.
- **46.** <u>Betsey Knickerbocker</u> (1798-) was probably the widow or ex-wife of Stephen Knickerbocker. She shows up in the 1840 census as a female head-of-household, with several children. Then, in 1850, Betsey and Samuel Jones are living with Elizabeth Santee and her husband, along with a teenager Charles Knickerbocker.
- **47.** <u>Elizabeth Santee</u> (1829-1871) was probably the daughter of Betsey and Stephen Knickerbocker. In 1850, Betsey and Charles were living with Elizabeth Santee and her husband John. Grave # 93738768 in Cazenovia, Madison County, New York.
- **48.** <u>Charles Knickerbocker</u> (1832-) was probably the son of Betsey, and probably the son of Stephen Knickerbocker. I do not know the fate of Charles or his wife Caroline.
- 49. <u>Caroline</u> (1838-) was the wife of Charles Knickerbocker.

Madison County Knickerbockers who are linked to Seymour

This next group of people are linked to a Seymour Knickerbocker. Seymour's first wife, Jennie Stanton, had ties to Madison County. After Seymour and Jennie divorced, Jennie apparently returned home for at least a brief time. Seymour himself may never have lived in Madison County. According to a well-documented tree on Ancestry, Seymour was b. 1840, Pompey, Onondaga NY and died 1930 Richmond, VA, and was 8th generation (HJ-1 / Lourens-2 / John-3 / Laurence-4 / Samuel-5 / Seymour-6 / Levi-7 / Seymour-8).

- **50.** <u>**Grace Knickerbocker**</u> (1877-1908) was the daughter of Seymour and Jennie Stanton Knickerbocker Phillips. (Grace and her siblings, Will and Edwin, are mentioned in Jennie's obituary.) Grace was a troubled young lady. There are many newspaper stories on Fultonhistory.com. Grace was married three times, and struggled with alcohol. A 1908 newspaper story said she was dying, alone, in a hospital in Philadelphia. Grave has not been located.
- 51. <u>C. William Knickerbocker</u> (1875-1919) was the son of Seymour and Jennie Stanton Knickerbocker. He later lived in Cortland County, NY, and had a daughter Ruth, in Cortland, with his second wife Alma Harriet Bush. His obituary shows him living in Homer, NY. Grave # 40460496 in Cazenovia, Madison County, New York.
- 52. <u>Effie Chaffee Knickerbocker</u> (1878-1930) was the first wife of C. William Knickerbocker. She was divorced from William in about 1909, in the Cortland area. Grave # 11900328 in Wamart, Wayne County, Pennsylvania.
- **53.** <u>Frank D. Knickerbocker</u> (1899-1952) was the son of Effie and William. Died in Carbondale, PA; death certificate lists both parents, William Knickerbocker and Effie Chaffee. Grave has not been located.
- 54. <u>Edward Knickerbocker</u> (1869-1938) was the son of Seymour and Jennie Stanton Knickerbocker. Obituary says he died when he was hit by a car in the Syracuse area, but I have not found him in Findagrave.
- **55.** <u>Sarah Adelaide Knickerbocker</u> (1865-1920) was the wife of Edward Knickerbocker. Her obituary is available on Fultonhistory, but I do not see her on Findagrave.
- 56. <u>Ethel Mae Knickerbocker</u> (1893-1976) was the daughter of Edward and Addie. Grave # 47856710 in Russia, Herkimer County, New York.
- 57. <u>Frank Louis Knickerbocker</u> (1896-1982) was the son of Edward and Addie. Grave # 73472011 in Syracuse, Onondaga County, New York.
- 58. <u>Edith L. Knickerbocker</u> (1898- after 1976) was the daughter of Edward and Addie. Mother's obituary (1920) describes her as Mrs Leslie Pentigill of Erie PA. Sister Ethel's obituary (1976) described her as Mrs Edith Baker of Binghamton. Grave # 80864869 in Binghamton, Broome County, New York.
- 59. Lodema Knickerbocker Peet (1826-1879) may have been the sister of Seymour Knickerbocker. Census records show a Lodema Peet who was born in Onondaga County in 1827. Findagrave shows her maiden name as Knickerbocker. Grave # 87447780 in Cazenovia, Madison County, New York.

The wife of Philip Knickerbocker

60. <u>Hannah Gardenier Harder Knickerbocker</u> (1772-1852) appears to have moved to the area late in life to live with other Harder relatives. She was not closely linked to the other Knickerbockers in the area. She was the wife of Philip Knickerbocker. She applied for a pension based on Philip's claimed served in the revolutionary war. The pension file contains biographical details such as her maiden name, wedding date, etc. Grave # 14750687 in Wampsville, Madison County, New York.

Untraced Knickerbockers in Madison County

- **61.** James Henry (JH) Knickerbocker (1822-1895) was a longtime resident of New Woodstock. He was well known, and is mentioned in many newspaper stories. The stories discuss his profession (harness maker) and civic and church activity (postmaster, choir leader). However, none of the stories, including his obituary, mention his parents or other Knickerbocker relatives. Census records show that he was born in Massachusetts. He apparently didn't have any children. It is hard to claim any link to the other major Knickerbocker lines in Madison County. Grave # # 40460411 in Cazenovia, Madison County, New York.
- **62.** <u>Sarah B. Richmond Knickerbocker (1832-1900)</u> was the wife of JH. Grave # 40460449 in Cazenovia, Madison County, New York.
- **63.** <u>H. Knickerbocker</u> (1850) is a female who appears only once, in the 1850 census, living with an elderly couple whose last name was Negus. This person then disappears. She may have been an orphan, but there is no way to track her or her parents.
- 64. <u>Marry Knickerbocker</u> (1821) appears only in the 1855 census. The census record says she was born in Madison County, putting her birth around 1831. It is hard to trace her lineage because she only shows up once. This is could be a granddaughter of Bartholomew.
- 65. <u>William Knickerbocker</u> (1820) is an unknown. He appears only once, in 1855. His birthplace is listed as Madison County. It is conceivable that he is the oldest son of Harmon Knickerbocker. (Harmon has an extra son in the 1820 census; this extra son has never been identified.) Or, he could be a grandson of Bartholomew.
- **66.** <u>Mi?S Knickerbocker</u> (1822) was the wife of William. The census sheet is smudged and unreadable, which is why a question mark appears in her name. Her roots and fate are unknown.
- 67. <u>Delia Knickerbocker</u> (1841) appears only in the 1865 census. 24 years old, placing her birth around 1841. State census says she was born in Madison County. She only shows up this one time, in 1865, which is odd. If she was born in 1841, she should show up somewhere in the 1850 census as a 9 year old, living with parents. There is no trace of her in 1850.
- 68. William Knickerbocker (1892), appears in 1915 and 1920. No idea who he was.

69. <u>Arthur Knickerbocker</u> (1903 -) appears only in 1920, when he was a boarder in the same house as William. No idea who he was.
